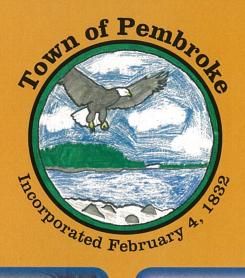
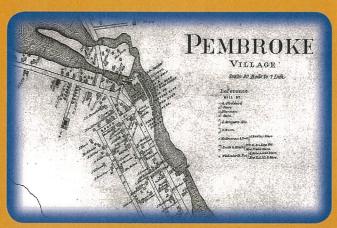

#### Clayton R. Dudley



Clayton graduated from Dennysville High School in 1944 and enlisted in the Navy in February 1945. He served aboard seven different ships, USS Los Angeles, USS Des Moines, USS Aludra and a number of other ships. He retired a SKC in September 1964. He worked for Maine Employment Office and then for U.S. Customs from 1970-82. He served on the Pembroke School Board.

David M. Cushing



David graduated from from Pembroke High School in 1967. He worked for DiCenzo's and Georgia Pacific. David was drafted into the Army in February 1969. He did 1 tour in Vietnam stationed with the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion 26<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. He was honorably discharged in 1971. He worked at Georgia Pacific until his death in March 1997.

Emery L. Davis



Emery enlisted in February 1943 in the Army Air Corp. He was discharged in February 1946. His duty stations included Dover, Del. Lincoln, Neb. and Kansas City and California. He was honorably discharged from the service as a sergeant with the American Service Medal and the Good Conduct Medal and World War II Victory Medal.

Iames A. Brown



James A. Brown was born January 29, 1918 and died August 19, 2005 at age 87. Jim graduated from Pembroke High School in 1935. He went to Maine School of Commerce in Bangor where he studied business. Jim served in the US Navy from 1942-1945. He served his country at the Brooklyn Naval Yard, the New London, CT Sub Base, and at Pearl Harbor. He was a storekeeper due to his ability to type, take shorthand, read and bookkeeping. Jim also served as a selectman and school board member for the Town of Pembroke for over 50 years.

The School Committee recommends <u>\$547,052.23</u> in additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by <u>\$547,052.23</u>

The cost of education per student is generally higher at small, rural schools. These additional Local funds are necessary to meet costs of educational services not recognized by the essential programs and services funding model.

#### Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Pembroke, Maine (the Town) as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents, including the related notes to the financial statements.

#### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

The supplementary information is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. The schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the State of Maine, and is also not a required part of the basic financial statements.

The supplementary information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of federal awards and supplementary information are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.
